but my days are very full at present. My husband had, unfortunately, another attack of Angina on Thursday evening, and although he is now going on well, the doctors insist on absolute rest and quiet. As you know he was in the midst of planning an Exhibition, which was to be run in two series of pictures, so that it is difficult to keep him quiet with his mind so actively engaged. We hope that it will not be necessary to postpone the Exhibition entirely, but that will depend on the advice of the Doctors. As seen as he is well enough we will leave hagland for the South of France. Our stay there last winder did him so much good that that the strength he was able to stope up then and during this summer in the country has enabled him to withstend this attach.

I am emaious that you should know just how my husband is, but I would request you very wrgently, and this is also his wash, that he fact that he has had a recurrence of his illness should not be made public, and I know that you will do your utmost to see that this is so.
